5. Fees & Expenses

Tuition Fee	Students nominated by partner universities are exempted from regular semester tuition and should enroll to their home universities.
Insurance fee	Students are required to join the National Health Insurance scheme from 2021. Fees per month is approximately KRW 80,000 per month(Subject to change).
Housing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Campus Dormitory: KRW 1,900,000 per semester• Self-housing: Around KRW 600,000 per month
Other Expenses	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Food: KRW 220,000 ~ 450,000 / month• Public Transportation: KRW 50,000 / month• Mobile Phone: KRW 30,000 ~ 50,000 / month• Books, Stationaries, etc.: KRW 100,000 / month• Average Total Cost: KRW 600,000 / month

6. Student Supports

Housing	Exchange students can choose to stay in our dormitory or off campus on their own.
Airport Pickup	<p>Free airport pickup is provided to students who arrive on designated dates. There are two airports – Incheon and Gimpo Airports. Please, make sure to arrive at the airport by 2pm in order to use this service.</p> <p>* Please make sure to send a scanned copy of your flight ticket to international@kw.ac.kr 2 weeks before the arrival date for reservation of the airport pickup service.</p>

<p>Buddy Program (1:1 Mentoring)</p>	<p>Exchange students are provided with 1:1 Mentoring(Buddy) Program within 2~3 weeks after the start date of the semester. Purpose of buddy program is to help the new students get used to the campus life in Korea and interact with Korean students to exchange and experience new culture. One Korean student would be paired with one international student.</p>
<p>Campus Facilities</p>	<p>International students can use various campus facilities such as: KLAS System, Library, Ice Rink, Basketball court, Computer Labs, etc.</p>
<p>International Students Program</p>	<p>Various programs are conducted exclusively for international students for their better experiences during their stay in Korea. The list of international students' programs is as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lunch Talk-Talk Program – This is a program that gives a chance to communicate with staff at International Office over lunch regarding living in Korea and study life, etc. • Friendship Night – This program helps international students to have fun through various programs and events while all international students gather and eat together. • Cultural Experience Program – It provides opportunities to experience Korean traditional and contemporary culture through interesting programs so that students can improve their Korean language skills, deep knowledge on Korean society and culture and enjoy a satisfactory university life.
<p>Extra-Curricular Activities</p>	<p>Students have opportunities to join various clubs (music, photography, hip-hop dance, piano, ice hockey, football, basketball, table tennis, etc.) and experience college annual festival where popular music and K-pop perform live on stage.</p>
